NOTES TO EDITORS

JEZ BUTTERWORTH – WRITER

Jez Butterworth was born in London, in 1969 and studied English at St. Johns College, Cambridge.

He has won numerous awards for his plays, including *Mojo* (Olivier Award for Best New Play, Evening Standard Award for Best New Play/Critic's Circle Award for Best New Play), *Jerusalem* (Evening Standard Award for Best New Play, Critic's Circle Award for Best New Play) and *The Ferryman* (Evening Standard Award for Best New Play, Critics' Circle Award for Best New Play, an Olivier Award for Best New Play, Tony Award for Best Play and Drama Desk Award for Outstanding Play).

In total he has written eight plays; *Mojo* (1995), *The Night Heron* (2002), *The Winterling* (2006), *Parlour Song* (2008), *Jerusalem* (2009), *The River* (2012) and *The Ferryman* (2017).

SAM MENDES – DIRECTOR

Sam Mendes founded and ran the Donmar Warehouse in London for ten years. He was a founding director of Neal Street Productions. His work has been seen at the National Theatre, RSC, Royal Court, The Old Vic, Young Vic, BAM, the West End and on Broadway. Most recently he has directed *The Motive and the Cue* at the National Theatre and in the West End, *The Lehman Trilogy* and *The Ferryman* in both London and New York. Films include *American Beauty, Road to Perdition, Jarhead, Revolutionary Road, Away We Go, Skyfall, Spectre, 1917* and *Empire of Light.* Film awards include the Academy Award for Best Director and Best Picture, three other Academy Award nominations, five BAFTA Awards, three Golden Globe Awards, two Directors Guild of America Awards and the PGA award. In theatre, he has won five Olivier Awards, the Olivier Special Award, six Tony Awards, four Evening Standard Awards, and the Hamburg Shakespeare Prize. He has also won the Directors Guild Award for lifetime achievement. He is an Honorary Fellow of the National Film and Television School, and a Fellow of Peterhouse, Cambridge. He was made a CBE in 2000 and knighted in 2020 for services to drama.



ROB HOWELL – DESIGNER

Rob has also worked extensively at the National Theatre, Royal Court, Almeida, Donmar, Young Vic, Bristol Old Vic, Chichester, Royal Opera House, Metropolitan Opera and on Broadway.

He won two Tony Awards for *The Ferryman* in 2019 (Royal Court/West End/Broadway) for Best Set and Best Costume Design and two Tony Awards for *A Christmas Carol* in 2021 (The Old Vic/Broadway) also for Best Set Design and Best Costume Design.

NATASHA CHIVERS – LIGHTING DESIGNER

Natasha was the Winner of Drama Desk Award 2023 for 'Outstanding Lighting Design for a Play' and nominated for the 2023 Olivier and Tony Awards 'Best Lighting Design in a Play' for *Prima Facie.*
